Studii şi cercetări lingvistice has come out uninterruptedly since 1950. In the 1950-1998 span, there were six issues per year, whereas in since 1999 the journal has had two issues per year.

Chronologically, the editors-in-chief of *Studii și cercetări lingvistice* were: V. Cheresteșiu (1950-1953), E. Petrovici (1954-1957), Al. Rosetti (1958-1971), I. Coteanu (1971-1997), M. Sala (1998-2018). Since 2019, editor-in-chief has been Ioana Vintilă-Rădulescu, the head of the Department of Romance Studies of the Institute of Linguistics, while deputy editor-in-chief has been Ioana Mariana Neț. Ever since 2000, *Studii și cercetări lingvistice* has also had an international board of editors, whose members ensure the publication of high quality articles, in compliance with international standards.
